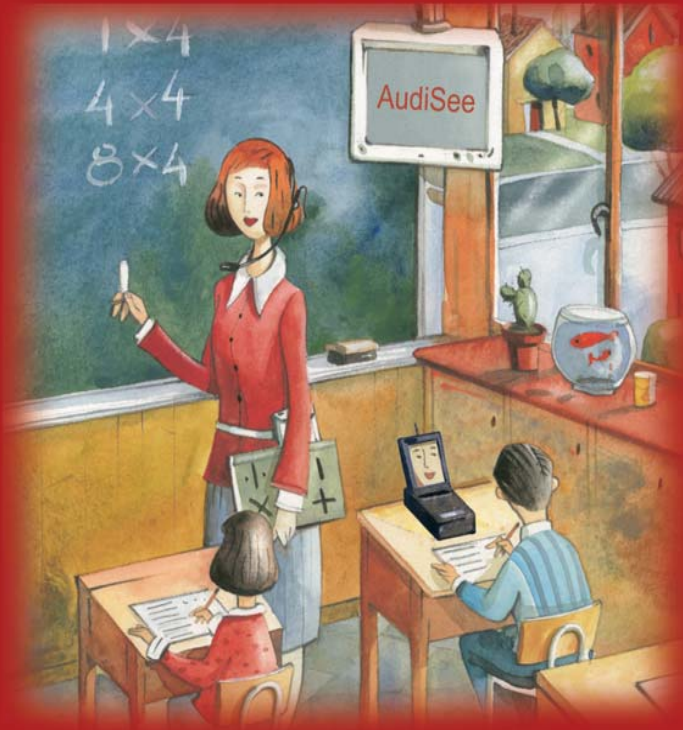

The system is simple. The teacher wears a headset-camera that has an integrated directional microphone. With AudiSee's patented wireless technology, the teacher's entire face is transmitted in real-time to a small monitor-receiver placed on the student's desk. In addition to this, the student can maximize the use of his/her residual hearing through direct audio input (hearing-aids or implant) or by setting the student's (audio-only) FM receiver to a channel compatible with the AudiSee.

AudiSee facilitates lip-reading and improves speech-perception. Consequently, the student can concentrate on learning rather than on deciphering the message.
